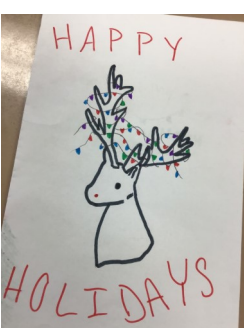

Russia banned from Olympics

Russia gets handed four-year ban after doping

On Monday, the World Anti-Doping Agency executive committee banned Russia from international competition for a years-long doping saga. This is the most severe punishment to date, withholding Russians from the next two Olympic Games.

The ban comes from when two Russian competitors failed drug tests for banned substances at the last Olympic Games. In turn, WADA made a list of Russian athletes who they had presumed to dope, including a core group of 145 athletes who they think are the most suspicious.

This decision means they will not be able to have a formal presence at next year's Summer Games in Tokyo

or the 2022 Winter Games in Beijing. Also, athletes will be barred from most major international competition through 2023, including the FIFA World Cup, Youth Olympic Games, and the Paralympics.

Russians not implicated in the country's state-sponsored doping scheme will however be allowed to compete in the Olympic Games as unaffiliated athletes. In the 2018 Winter Games in Pyeongchang, athletes competed as "Olympic Athletes from Russia", but in Tokyo the unaffiliated athletes will be recognized by another name.

Anti-doping officials have been very hesitant to embrace any measures that might unintentionally trap innocent athletes. Those who hope to compete in the Tokyo games or other major events must

prove that they have no history of doping. They must have no drug positive findings in their records in order to show they haven't cheated.

On top of that, Russia won't be able to host any major sporting event or even apply for hosting duties for the duration of their ban. Their flag will not be able to fly at any major event, which will be a long four years for the country.

In addition to the four year ban, Russia must pay a \$100,000 fine. The country has been warned and

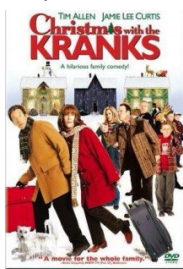

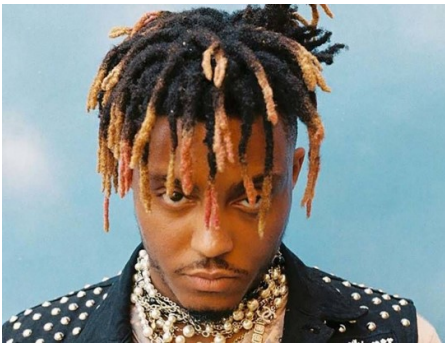

Many questions revolve around Juice Wrld death

December 2nd, 1998 Jarad Higgins was born in Chicago, IL. The rapper we all knew as Juice Wrld grew up in Chicago all throughout his younger years and began music at a very young age. After beginning to take music seriously Jarad had a couple songs go viral on Soundcloud but the song that pushed him over the top and blew him up was "Lucid Dreams" which was released early in 2018 and "All Girls Are The Same" which was also released early in 2018. After the release of those two songs Juice Wrld's name got out and he began to get more and more songs on Apple Music, Spotify, and other music streaming apps.

Juice Wrld began to release music for the other rappers that have passed away such as Lil Peep, XXXTentacion, and Mac Miller and had lyrics which many people find controversial such and the lyrics "They tell me I'ma be a legend I don't want that title now 'Cause all the legends seem to die out". And Juice



Wrld actually left more possible hidden messages in his songs some tying to John Lennon who died on the same day several years prior. He also had lyrics talking about how he won't make it past 21 which he died at the age of 21.

On December 8, 2019 Juice Wrld's private jet was landing at Chicago's Midway Airport with 70 pounds of marijuana, 3 registered guns and a few other drugs such as pills. The pilot of the private jet had been in contact with the Chicago police, and when the jet landed, the police were waiting to search the plane. Shortly after landing Jarad had taken more pills to hide them from the police after he had already taken some on the plane. While walking through the airport, he fell to the ground and started having a seizure. Police say when medical attention arrived Juice Wrld was still conscious and was bleeding from the mouth but shortly after he was rushed to the hospital, he was pronounced dead.

Last carver of Mt Rushmore dies, 98

The man believed to be the last living carver of Mount Rushmore has passed away.

Donald "Nick" Clifford was one of the roughly 400 men and women who took part in carving Mount Rushmore. Before he died, he spent a lot of time at the monument, handing out signed baseball cards and taking pictures with people. Clifford died last Saturday while on hospice in Rapid City.

It took nearly 14 years to carve this masterpiece, Clifford was only a teenager when he started working on it. He worked for two years (1938-1940) only making 55 cents an hour. With inflation that is around 10 dollars an hour. "The work was hard, the hours were long, and the pay was low," stated Clifford.

Clifford also told the *Rapid City Journal* that despite the very dangerous working conditions, there were zero fatalities.

"I feel like Mount Rushmore was the greatest thing with which I was ever involved," he told the *Rapid City Journal*. "It tells a story that will never go away ... the story of how America was made and the men who helped make it what it is today."

Clifford lived a happy life living west river his whole life, talking about his story and living the dream with his wife.

Two shootings, two days apart

Last week was a shock and full of horrific events when two



shootings on military bases took place. On Wednesday the first shooting happened at the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard in Hickam, Hawaii. The shooter was Antonio Romero who was an active duty sailor. The other was on Friday in Pensacola, Florida at the Naval Air Station whose name was released to be Mohammed Alshamrani. Alshamrani was a second lieutenant from the Royal Saudi Air Force here training. Could these two shootings be a coincidence or planned?

Taking place that Wednesday at the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard, Antonio Romero, 22 years old, took the life of two department of defense civilians and wounding the third with his M4 service rifle. He then proceeded by taking his own life with a M9 service pistol.

All this took place in under 23 seconds and not to mention 3 days before the Pearl Harbor Remembrance 78 years ago from that coming Saturday. Police have investigated Romero's motive to see if the shooting was associated of terrorism but that is not believed to be the reason. It was an unexpected event

that had no red flags or thoughts of it being planned.

Meanwhile on Friday the Pensacola shooting was a different story. Alshamrani tweeted the day before his act about how the US was "evil" and showed videos of mass shootings at a dinner party he attended. Alshamrani was a 21 year old second lieutenant apart of the Saudi Air Force training for various military requirements. He had killed three sailors injuring eight other with a Glock 45 9mm pistol. Alshamrani was then shot by County Sheriff deputies who had been called to the scene.

The real question was how did a non-American citizen obtain a gun? Well, before the investigation was dug into, the police noted he had illegally bought a gun in Florida that summer. After more research it was found that Alshamrani had hunting licenses that allowed him to purchase the gun and ammunition which was legal. Police and reporters has said this was a pure act of terrorism along with the red flags ignored that made it apparent, but it had not been connected to the Pearl Harbor shooting two days before.
