Wrestlers take down competition in opening tournament

Garretson grapplers place well but leave room for improvement throughout the season

The Garretson varsity grapplers hit the mat for the first time this season in Flandreau last weekend. With only eight wrestlers on Saturday's roster, the team performed well but showed lots of room for improvement.

Tayson Swatek and Dakota Johnson experienced first-time nerves, but their performances on the mat were promising.

Dakota Johnson, rounding out the final weight class, recalled, "I think I did an okay job on Saturday, but I could have done better. I just need to get a feel for wrestling and get more experience on the mat."

Hayden Pierret placed 2nd in the 120 weight class against Zak Fowler from Elk Point-Jefferson, Dakota Johnson placed 2nd in the 285 weight class against Silas Larsen from Sioux Valley, and Ben Konechne placed 4th in the 195 weight class against Elk Point-Jefferson's Hunter Ewing.

The team finished with 43 points total and placed seventh out of the eight teams. "I think the team needs to step up. We all need to relax and get back into the feel of wrestling, and also improve after every meet," Johnson commented on their performance.

Pierret added, "Our team did alright on Saturday, but there are a lot of new

teammates this year. We need to work the most on finishing moves."

On Monday, the JV wrestlers went to Flandreau to participate in their JV tournament.

Dominick Abraham placed 1st, Trenton Karli, Lucas Fitzgerald, and Dakota Johnson placed 2nd, and the 3rd place wrestlers were Tayson Swatek, Jayse Miller, and Hayden Stot-

Garretson also went to Volga yesterday to participate in a quad against Sioux Valley, Parker, and Mt. Vernon.

The other big success story came from freshman Nobel Nothstine in Creed Speaking. She placed 4th. That was my best performance yet."


