# Lady Blue Dragons notch their first win of the season on Tuesday

With a 61-55 win over the Canton C-Hawks, Garretson looks to keep that momentum going into this weekend

The Lady Blue Dragons are now four games into their 20 game season, after starting out winless through the first three, they bounced back and took a victory in Canton on Tuesday after a devastating loss on Saturday to Chester Area. The girls basketball team is looking for a strong showing out of the squad this year after returning three seniors. The last game proved they were up to the task at hand.

After falling short in their earlier

contests, seniors Macey Bohl and Kindra Clark stepped up and scored 17 and 13, respectively. The points offered by them along with junior Erynn Fink's 19 rebounds propelled the Dragons to their first victory still early in the season. The final score was 61-55 in Garretson's favor.

Sophomore Kyley Greenhoff said, "I think this year's coaches have brought a lot of good ideas to the team. If we build on them and add more excitement and energy, it'll be a fun season."

With a new coaching staff and a new roster, the girl's season looks

guite different from last year. The ladies have adjusted well and that is being shown early.

Fink added, "It's good seeing wins this early in the year, it just shows how good we could actually be."

Garretson is scheduled to head to Colman-Egan tomorrow for the Entringer Classic, going head to head Oldham-Ramonaagainst Rutland. The Blue Dragons are looking for their second win on the year, and coming off a hard fought win would be a great momentum booster for the remainder of the season.

#### DIY Gift: Holiday Bath Bombs

It's the most wonderful time of the year, but it's also the season where money is tight. Here is one amazing do-it-yourself craft that can be made with items that you may already have in your home. With a little love and creativity, this will also make the perfect Christmas present.

There's nothing like a warm, relaxing bath in the winter time. With a few ingredients, you can create the greatest gift for anyone that loves a little scented tranquility.


What you'll need: 1 cup baking soda, 1/4 cup cream of tartar, 1/2

JOKE: In a snowbank

cup cornstarch, 1/2 cup Epsom salt (or any noniodized salt), and 1 teaspoon water. Optional: 2 teaspoons essential oil for scent (i.e. peppermint, lavender), 1

tablespoon oil for moisturizing (i.e. olive oil, coconut oil), non-toxic glitter, and 4-5 drops of food coloring of your choice. Also, you'll need some sort of mold for the bath bombs such as a cupcake pan, a cut in half tennis ball, or even an old play-doh mold.

1. In one bowl, mix together baking soda, cream of tartar, cornstarch, and the salt.



in with the dry ingredients and stir until evenly mixed. 4. Add in the food coloring and mix until you reach your desired

5. Put the mix into a mold of your choice and let dry for 1-2 hours, or overnight if you don't plan on using it right away.

6. After removing the mold, wrap it in tissue paper as a gift, or toss the bath bomb in the bath and watch it dissolve for yourself.

The Entringer Classic on December 31 in Brookings is the next game on their schedule. Garretson is slated to play Arlington.






While the candy coating is still soft,


place a mini Oreo on the top as the snowman's hat.

Hannah Frewaldt wins 3rd-5th grade spelling bee on Suet


