Choir solo and ensemble contest keeps singers busy

Garretson choir students showcase their talents on Monday at Augustana

On Monday, April 13th, eleven of Garretson's singers traveled to Augustana University to showcase their abilities at the day long Solo and Small Ensemble Contest.

How this generally works is that a student will choose and practice a piece for at least three weeks prior to the contests. After they've perfected the piece, they will perform it in front of a single judge and earn a rating from one to five, one being the highest rating possible. Students or groups that earn a rating of one are qualified for State Solo & Ensemble Festival which is held in March, implying that only the highest of the superior ratings amongst hundreds of competing choir students will have the potential to move on to state.

This year, Garretson excelled at their pieces and all students received either a two or a one rating (superior and excellent). The students are judged based on multiple performing aspects including stage presence, tone, volume, and diction. The judg-

es sheet also contains comments on what the student did well, what they liked about their piece, and how to improve their voice for the future.

Senior Abriana Scholl stated, "[Difficulty] depends on how well you practiced your music. If you don't put a whole lot of time and effort into practice, it will be difficult. I received a superior rating of a 29 out of 30."

Also coming with back strong score was freshman Aliah Lymon. Aliah performed perfectly, garnering a 30/30.

The reason why many students participate in these contests are to further advance their singing/ performing abilschoolmates

and visit with

other schools, gain experience, add the awards to college applications, or even to just get out of school.

Scholl continued, "I enjoy getting to make music and making new friends along the way."

Ms. Robinson, choral director, said, "It takes a lot of guts to get up and sing in front of people. I'm proud of them all."




