

The golfers then traveled to Volga for their final regular season meet on May 13. Dylan Kindt took 12th place with a 90 followed by Long who shot an 87 for 10th place. Uhlich won the boy's tournament shooting an 84. On the girls' side, Hanson shot a 96 to take home ninth.

The golfers will be moving into post season play next week and into June. They will compete in the regional golf meet in Mitchell next Monday. If they qualify, the golfers will then go on to state golf on June third and fourth, which will be hosted in Yankton.

Fiegen also placed first in high jump yesterday with a jump of 6'5". But yesterday many more Blue Dragons added their name to the state gualifier list. This was done by either meeting the state qualifying standard or finishing in the top two of their event.

Joining Fiegen as a boys' representative is Preston Bohl. Bohl finished second in the 3200m with a time of 10:39.39.

The girls had a very successful outing as well. Individually Makayla Heesch (1600m, 5:54.06), Morgan Damman (400m, 1:06.15), Payton Campbell (3200m, 12:51.31), and Madden Lardy (shot put, 32'11") all qualified for the state meet next weekend.

That team was comprised of Damman, Lily Ranschau, Aliyah Leedy, and Makayla Heesch. The girls 4x800m team finished in first place with a team time of 10:34.27. Bye sister Social media controversies exposes discovery, loyalty, and backstabbing
