> Other things to keep in mind this winter are as follows:

- If you're about to leave to drive somewhere, start your car at least ten to fifteen minutes early to let it sit and warm up.
- Keep extra gloves, hats, blankets, and other articles of clothing in your car (like socks).
- Make sure you have a full (or close to) tank of gas if you're going some place that will take some time to get there.
- Make sure your lights are working properly; and don't forget to turn them off when you arrive at your destination! Keeping your lights on will drain your car's battery and then you'll run into some problems.
- Be careful of black ice, slush, or fresh/ falling snow. Roads may become a hazard and you could potentially get into a scary accident if you aren't watching out and driving carefully.
- Slow down on roads that could have potential ice, or if it's snowing.

Keep these things, and others, in mind to help ensure that you are safe during the cold, snowy, harsh South Dakota/Minnesota winter.
