Parade of Lights:

The 26th annual Parade of Lights was on Friday, November 24th. The dazzling light show started at 7:30 pm and ended at 9 pm. This year was the very first year having a Jr. Grand Marshal leading the parade, Sean Kjergaard, a Brandon Valley student, and a Special Olympics and Feeding South Dakota volunteer.

Many awards were given out after the parade including, the CenturyLink Best Use of Lights which was awarded to Oakridge Nursery - for their float "Creating Outdoor Environment for Mrs. Claus & Your Elves Since 1979". Best Workmanship went to Combat Veteran Motorcycle Association for their float "American Freedom Christmas". The Spirit of Sioux Falls award was given to Knights of Columbus for "A Beacon of Hope". The Mayor's Choice went to Stockyards Ag Experience for "Home Grown Holidays". The final award was Downtown Sioux Falls Board Choice which went to Catfish Bay for "Lighted Pyramids"

The 27th annual Parade of Lights will be Friday, November 23, 2018.

Western Mall:

The Western Mall in Sioux Falls is once again hosting their Christmas light show for Make-A-Wish. They didn't have one last year due to declining donations but this year they are coming back strong. The show is organized by Joseph Noe, who origi-

nally had a show at his home in Crooks before it moved inside the Western Mall in 2010.

Over the past 11 years the light show has helped raise \$225,481.30 for Make-A-Wish of South Dakota. The wishes of more than 30 South Dakota children have come true from proceeds of the light display.

A few special events will also be going on during the show to help get more viewers. Friday, December 1st, The Better Living Store in the Western Mall will be giving away candy for the kids. Plus the first 1,000 adults will receive a coupon for a free massage in one of their state-of-the-art massage chairs. Sunday December 3rd, the AR Workshop in the Western Mall will be giving away coupons to make a free ornament, but only to the first 50 kids. All giveaways will begin at 6:00 pm and will continue until they are all gone.

The show runs from Thanksgiving through New Year's Day nightly from 5:30pm-9:30pm. The show is located in the center court area which allows viewers to comfortably enjoy five songs dancing through thousands of twinkling lights. It even features a fenced in snowy yard with a 24-ft. tall castle structure. The show runs about 15 minutes with a three minute intermission between sets. The overall show sponsor is Scheels, along with several other area businesses who helped make the display possible.

Falls Park:

Falls Park just recently lit up the

Sioux Falls holiday season, turning on their annual light show which includes, 355,926 total LEDs and lights, 270 trees decorated, 275 light poles decorated, more than 25 miles of light strings, half a mile of rope lights, and 400 wreaths.

The holiday light show will be on display every evening between 5 p.m. and midnight until January 7th. The light display costs the city parks department approximately \$115,000 to put on each year.

To get the best view, it's best to go up to the fifth story of the Visitor Information Center, which is open from 5-9 p.m. Monday-Thursday, 5-10 p.m. on Fridays, 10 a.m.-10 p.m. on Saturdays, and 10 a.m.-9 p.m. on Sundays.

Brandon:

Located at 120 West Conifer Street in Brandon, there is another light show going on. The show performs Sunday - Thursday at 5:30PM - 9:30PM. And Friday - Saturday 5:30PM - 10:30PM. The show started Thanksgiving night and will run through New Year's Day. Simply pull to the side of the road, shut off your headlights, leave your parking lights on, and tune your radio to 93.1 FM to enjoy the show.

Madison's Magical Christmas:

On December 9th, the Madison Chamber is having a Christmas festival from 9:30 AM to 5:30 PM. It includes, meeting Santa, a free movie, sleigh rides, ice skating, community bingo, and the community Christmas tree lighting.

Mount Agung ready to blow

Indonesian volcano has been showing signs that a major eruption is imminent

The highest point on the island of Bali, Mount Agung, started erupting last week but emergency agencies in Bali still warn of a larger eruption. The last time the volcano erupted was in 1963 which resulted in more than 1,700 deaths.

On the 21st of November the volcano had a phreatic eruption which is an explosion of steam that throws water, ash, and rocks out of the volcano. Four days later it had a magmatic eruption which means that magma actually reached the surface.

They issued a level 4 alert, the highest level of alert, because the larger eruption could happen at any mo-

ment. Flights were canceled because of the eruption and the 5.6 mile high ash clouds from Mount Agung. The eruptions also prohibited any public activities within a six mile radius around the volcano.

There are approximately 100,000 people living in the danger zone; around 30,000 of them have already evacuated their homes. Bali had rescuers going into the danger zone to help people but they often faced resistance as some of the locals don't want to leave their homes; some reasons are to protect gardens and livestock.

Bali is a very popular tourist destination in Indonesia and some of the tourists were stuck in Bali for three extra days because of Mount Agung erupting multiple times last Saturday. All of the flights were grounded until Wednesday.

After everything people in Bali have seen they expect the larger eruption to happen soon and have been preparing for it since the first signs of eruption, hoping to have a better outcome than 1963 but that is up to the volcano and the people in the evacuation area.

Derrick Rose's series of unfortunate events has propelled questions about his future

"With the First pick in the 2008 NBA Draft, the Chicago Bulls select, Point Guard Derrick Rose out of the University of Memphis" With these words, the Chicago Bulls unleashed a beast upon the NBA.

Rose started off his career hot. In the beginning, he was better than some of the best point guards in the NBA today. Rose won MVP of the regular season in 2011, the only Bulls player to get an MVP trophy besides Michael Jordan.

Rose was a slashing point guard; he didn't have the greatest jumper. But Rose could get whatever he wanted in the paint whether it was a crazy and-one layup, or a poster over a defender. He was said to be the most explosive point guard in NBA history by many.

Derrick Rose's historic career came to a halt during the 2011-2012 season. Rose missed 27 regular season games with various injuries. The Bulls still managed to make the playoffs, but Rose tore his left ACL in game one of the playoffs against the Philadelphia 76ers and Chicago struggled from there.

After his return in 2013, he played only 10 games before tearing his meniscus; he then tore it again in 2015. Rose has been out countless times since with various injuries, but still finds ways to power through and continue playing.

Rose hasn't been the same since that ACL tear in 2012. Rose's stellar performance before has declined to average level for a point guard which is amazing when considering the setbacks he has had. Rose was traded to the New York Knicks last season and played one year there.

In New York Rose averaged 18 points per game, and 4.4 assists per game, this was one of Rose's best seasons after the ACL tear.

After that year was over a video game called NBA 2k rates players on their season by giving them an overall rating, Derrick Rose's was a 78, and rookies Markelle Fultz and Lonzo Ball were both given 80s. This made a lot of people mad because it was the lowest they had ever rated Rose, a former MVP. NBA 2k never changed it.

Coming into this season, Rose signed a contract with the Cleveland Cavaliers, in hopes of getting a Championship. When you look at Derrick Rose's awards all he needs to be in the hall of fame, is a championship. The NBA hall of fame is a complete joke considering all you need is trophies, there are players in the hall of fame that average five points per game but are in the hall of fame because they played with Bill Russell, and got multiple championships. But, only seven games into the regular season, Rose is out with an ankle injury. Some dems making push to impeach the president

Recently, six congressmen have pushed forward articles to impeach President Donald Trump. The democrats placed together five articles of impeachment against the current president. These basis of these articles focus on the idea that Trump is a danger to our county if his leadership continues.

Although this process is still in its beginning stages and has grounds to be successful, it will be very difficult as only two presidents have been

impeached before: Andrew Johnson and Bill Clinton.

In order for Trump to be removed from office, the House of Representatives must vote, requiring a simple majority. After that the Senate votes, which requires a 2/3 majority finding the president guilty. This will be difficult considering the heavy republican representation.

The impeachment clauses involved obstruction of justice after firing FBI Director James Comey and violating emoluments clauses which prohibit the president from receiving gifts from foreign countries and from profiting while in office.
