If worse comes to worst, Christmas break is coming up, so those who are sick will have time to rest and recover.



More women 58% than men 45% say setting smaller and more realistic goals will help them keep their New Year's resolutions. Senior, Eryn Fink, could've built a house on Saturday with all the



President Trump signed a new tax reform which Congress has been working tirelessly on since Trump was elected. The bill changes tax rates and benefits business owners and the upper class, while giving smaller tax breaks for middle class families. While the bill decreases taxes in the short term, over the next ten years, taxes are expected to rise which Trump says will promote economic growth.

Train derailment kills three

Speeds almost three times over the limit, possible distraction, caused derailment

On Monday, an Amtrak train derailed leaving 3 people dead and over 100 injured. The accident that occurred in Washington state sent rail cars plummeting off the track on a highway hitting several cars and semi's.

The train was traveling at 80 mph in a zone with a speed limit of 30 mph which caused 13 of its 14 rail cars off the track hitting several cars on the road. An investigation is taking place as officials are still uncertain of how this accident took place and why actions were not taken to prevent it from happening.

Automatic braking and systems that slow the train down was not activated in the event which leaves many pondering the situation.
