- 2-5 minutes is your time frame, anything under 2 minutes cannot receive better than a D and you will be asked to give your speech again. This does not assure if you go over 2 minutes, that you will do better than a D. You must practice, practice!

- You must use the proper outline formatting and levels
- Use a creative attention getter
- Consistently use eye contact with the audience.
- You need a minimum of three resources for this speech.
- A works cited page must be accompanied with your outline.
- Keep this speech positive—the person is receiving an award

#### 6. Hints -

- Add details to the facts you share and use descriptive words
- 100% eye contact in intro and conclusion
- Glance at the outline during the body (key words should trigger your thoughts)
- Smile, show enthusiasm
- Be positive
- Remember you are the expert on this person, act that way
- Project your voice and use diction
- Practice! (It will make you sound more confident as well as less nervous)
- Not all items on the sample outline need to be used
